More Ways to Save



Clean or replace your furnace filter and have your heating system tuned and inspected by a service professional. Heat losses from malfunctioning or poorly performing systems can add up – sometimes up to 2% per year.



Prevent heat loss as warm air travels through heat ducts from your furnace by wrapping ducts with insulation.



Check insulation and seals along doors, windows, recessed lights and at your attic entrance to make sure cold air is staying out. Window kits are also an inexpensive option in helping prevent drafts from windows.



Seal cracks in your basement floor and where pipes, wires or ducts enter your home. Close attic, basement and garage or exterior doors to help retain heat.
